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History of Speech-Language Pathology Assistants



"ASHA has addressed the topic of support personnel in speech-language pathology since the 1960s."

In Florida:

- Process started in 1991
- Initial rule effective date: 5/22/1996
- . Amended in 2013
- Amended April 2020: Added SLPA Protocol Rule

ASHA AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

Over time, ASHA has progressively expanded its support for these professions:

- * 2002 and 2003: credentialing program for SLPA
 - ** training programs
 - ** voluntary registration program
- * 2011, ASHA launched Associates Program
 - ** SLPAs and audiology assistants join as affiliates
 - ** 5-year pilot program
 - ** evaluated at the end of that term
- * 2015, the ASHA Board of Directors voted Associates Program an ongoing program of ASHA
 - ** BOD standardization of requirements for audiology assistants and SLPAs
 - ** approved feasibility study regarding credentialing assistants

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ASHA FEASIBILITY STUDIES

- · Audiology assistants and SLPAs: positive impact on client service delivery
- · Advantages outweigh the challenges
- · National credential: multiple benefits (i.e., supervisors and employers)
- · ASHA: provide assistant certification
- · Inconsistency in qualifications, ability levels
- · Resources needed for supervisors and assistants

- 2019–2020 developed and validated standards and the examination
- 2020 examinations began

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ASHA Supervision Guidelines for the SLP

The supervising SLP must meet the following CFCC requirements:

- Hold CCC-SLP and/or possess the necessary state-credentials;
- completion of a minimum of 9 months after CCC-SLP
- completion of a minimum of 2 hours of professional development in clinical instruction/supervision; (recommended that it have content related to supervision of SLPAs)
- adherence to state guidelines for supervision of the SLPA;
